## Bringing change through political, civic and national movements

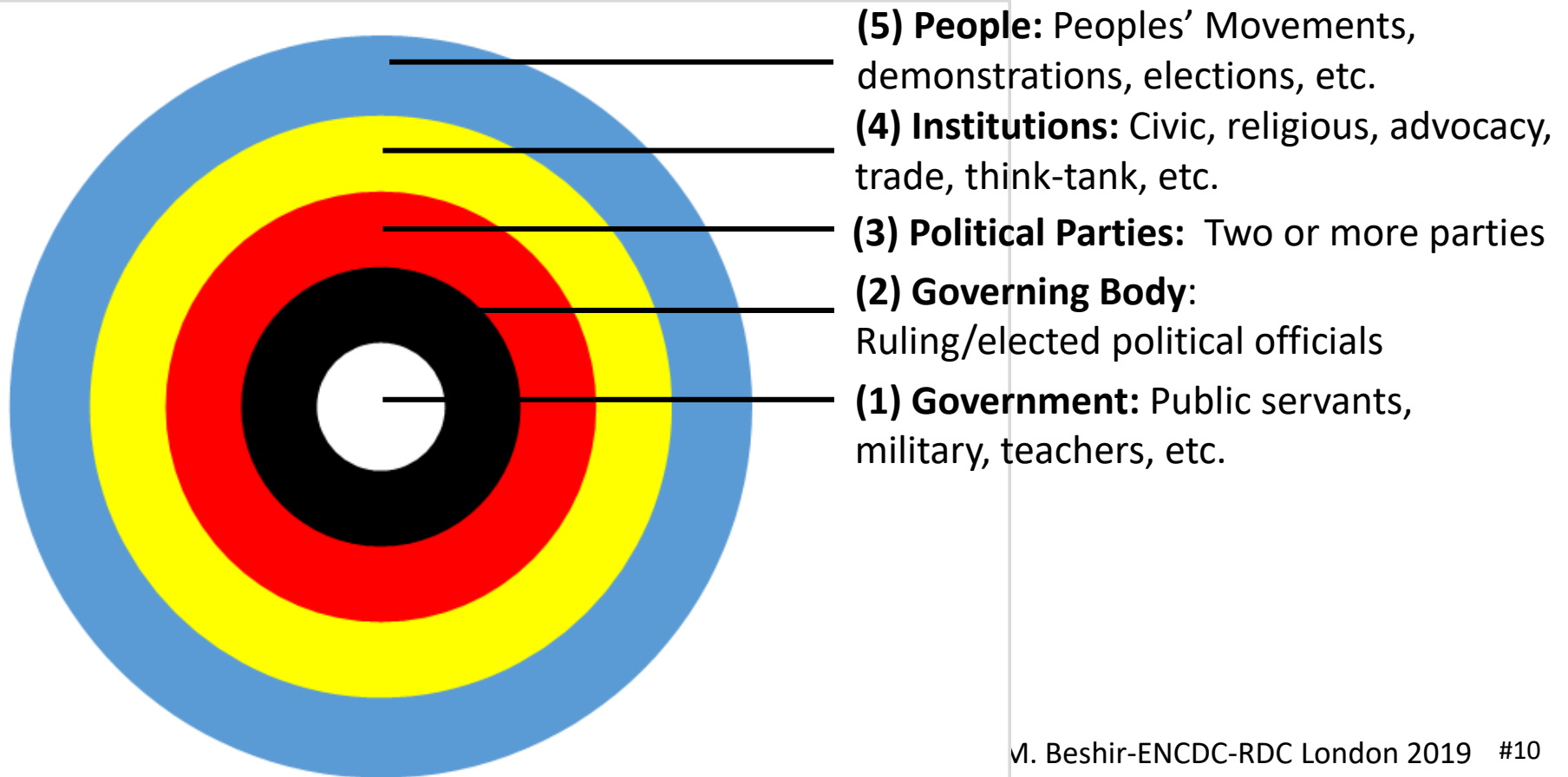


1. In this critical hours of Eritrea's political situation, it is unacceptable and inexcusable to stay in the sideline.

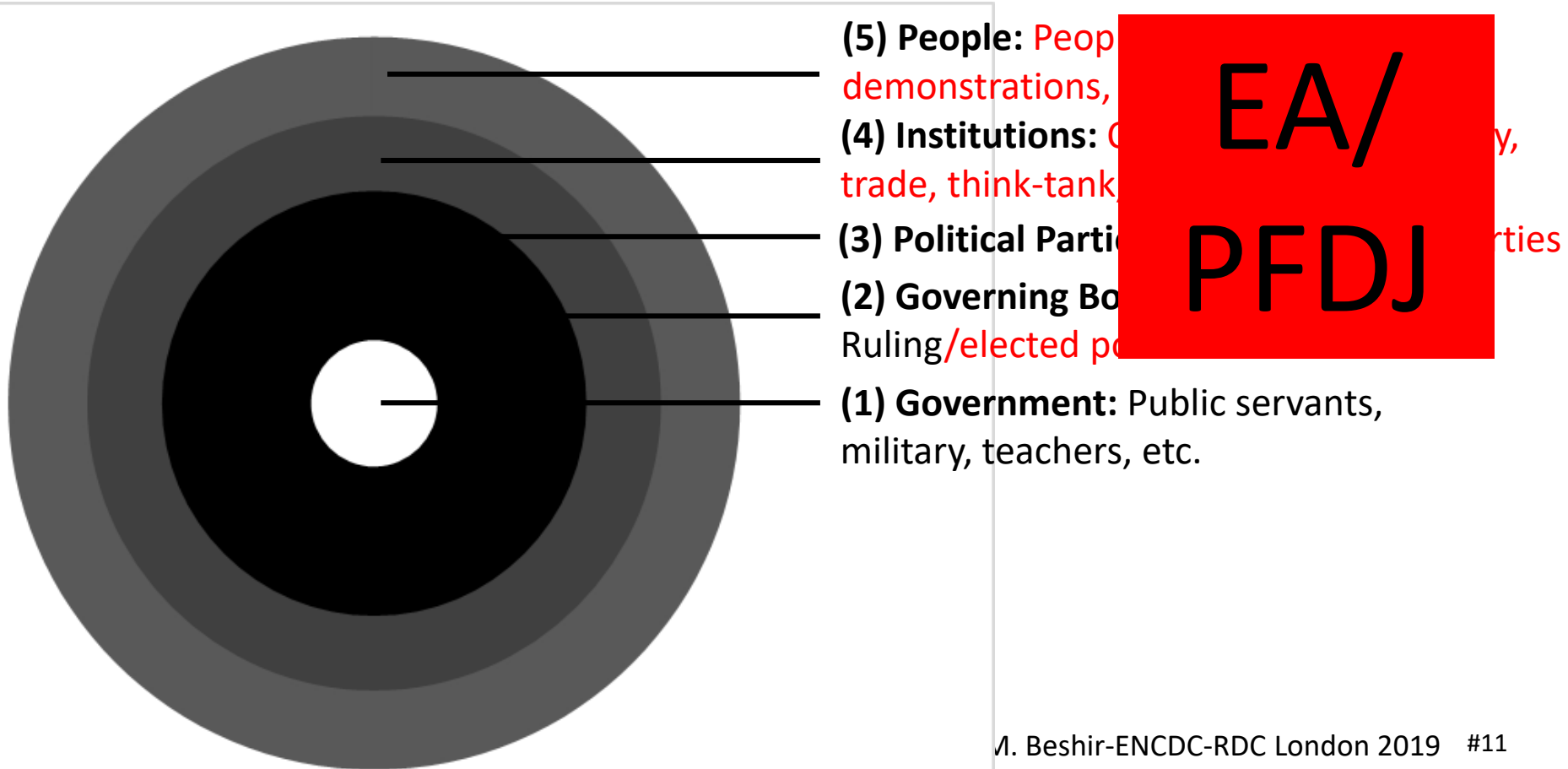
## The Five Distinct Roles of a Democratic System of Government

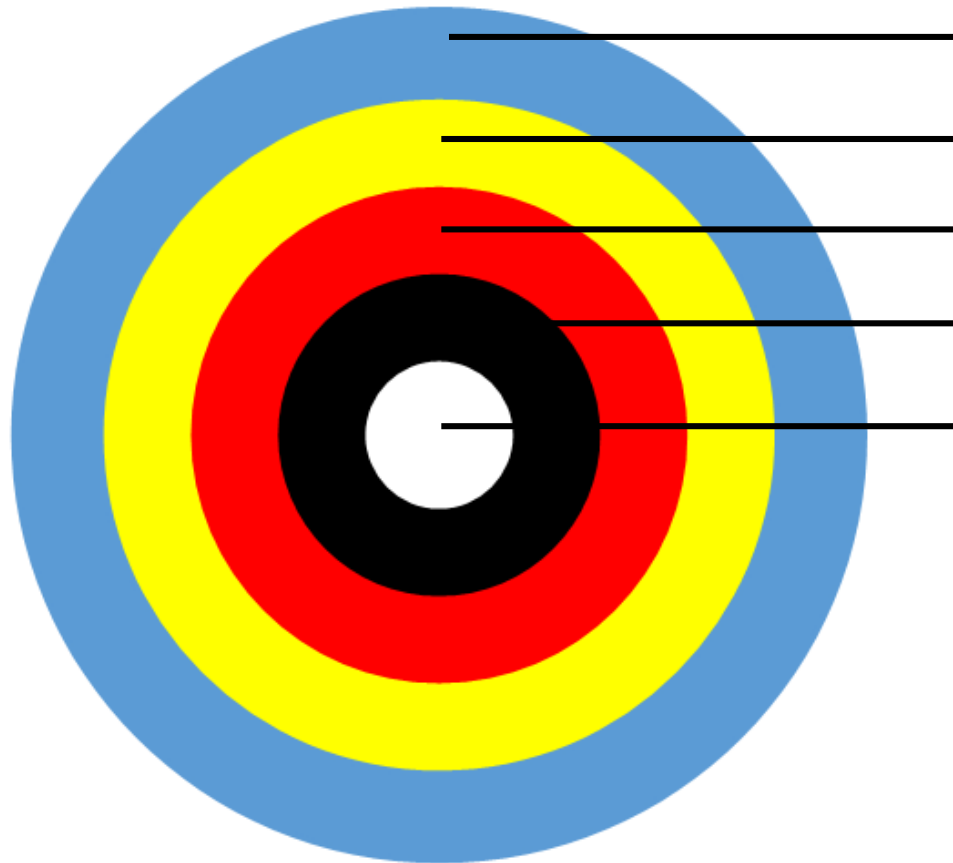
## Dictatorial Governmental System in Eritrea Today

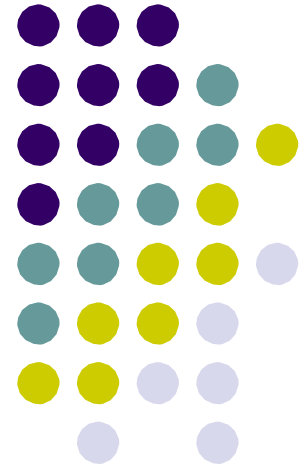
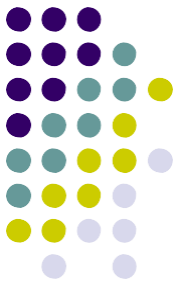

# ENCDC 2<sup>nd</sup> National Congress



1. It was held on April 17-21, 2019, in Stockholm, Sweden, 7+ years after the 1<sup>st</sup> National Congress that was held in Awasa, Ethiopia in November 2011.
2. There were various reasons, some self-made conflicts within Bayto (ENCDC), and some due to external issues, that didn't allow Bayto to make significant progress in bringing any significant political change in the Eritrean diaspora politics.
3. The 2<sup>nd</sup> National Congress, even though it was smaller in scope, has resulted in a new spirit of cooperation, new governance documents, and new leadership.
4. Some of the key accomplishments of the 2<sup>nd</sup> National Congress:
  - a) Done entirely with funding from Eritreans
  - b) Created a streamlined process by reducing the number of central and executive committee members
  - c) Adapted a concise political charter and bylaws (constitution) and provided a methodology to address a transitional charter during the transitional period.
  - d) Advanced the practical aspects of national harmony and unity by establishing a separate executive office of "Reconciliation, Dialog, and Coordination"
  - e) Established an executive office that include the mobilization of Eritrean grassroots movements

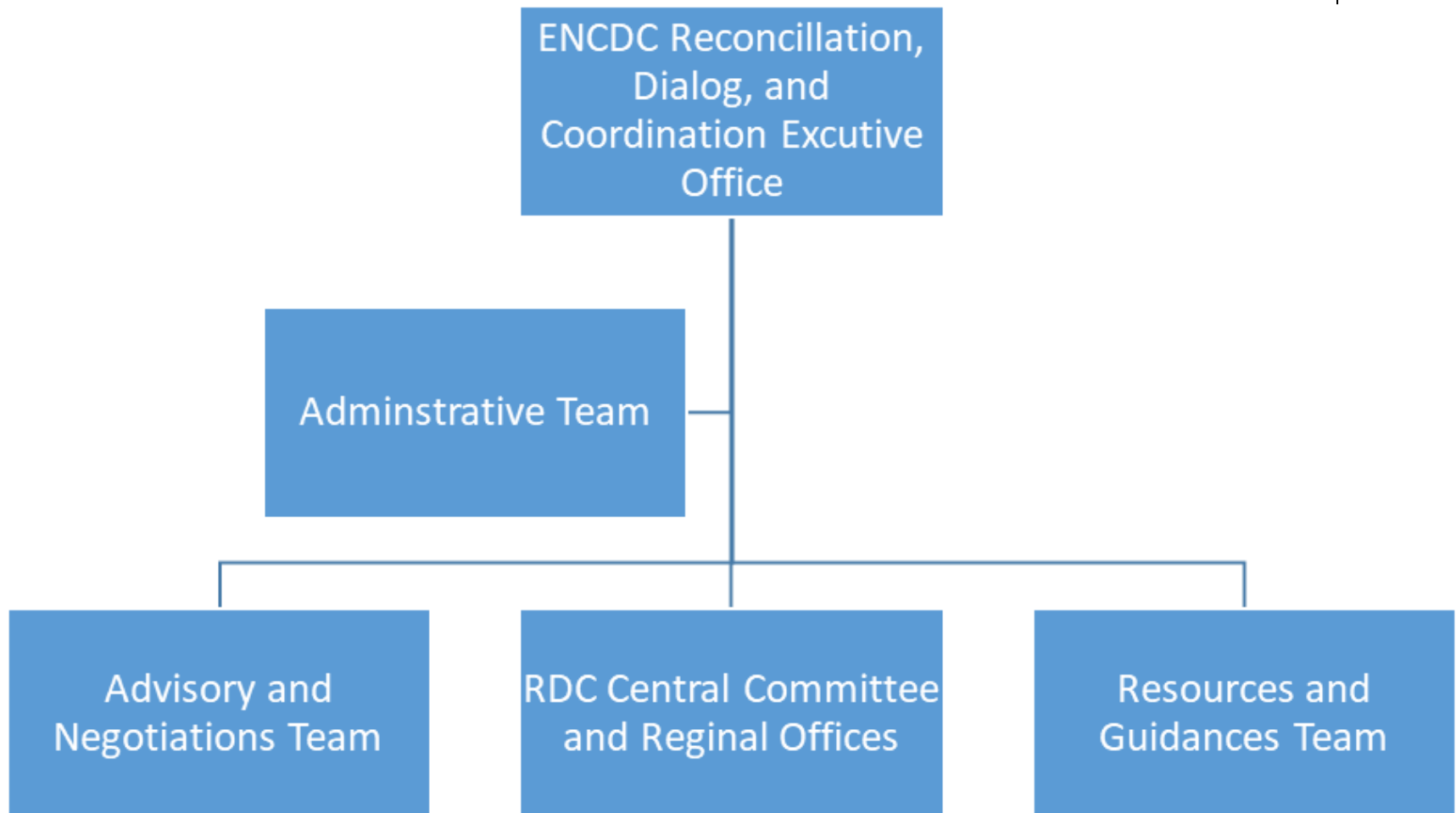
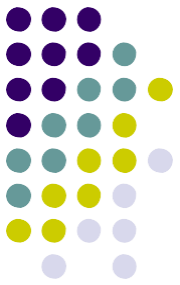


# ENCDC-RDC Initiatives



1. Strive to create the atmosphere for dialogue with all parties outside the Council, in order to reach a joint work between them and the National Council.
2. To carry out continuous initiatives to achieve coordination and unity within the opposition forces by unifying their political vision.
3. To form a special committee to assist the Office of Reconciliation, Dialogue and Coordination in the Executive Office in the performance of its functions in the context of dialogue and coordination with the various Eritrean parties.
4. Encourages organizations with one or close political programs to take practical and relevant steps.
5. Seeking to establish a bridge of communication with the opposition political movement inside the homeland.

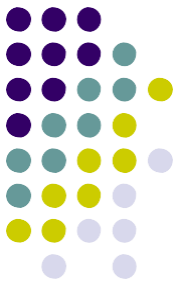
3. Have initiated various discussions with other political parties, civic and Yakil movement groups

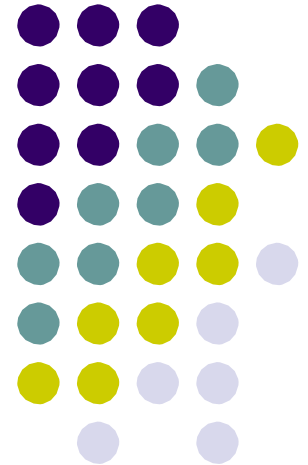
## “Agreement”



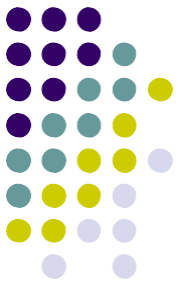
1. Coordinate our efforts to defeat the dictatorial regime and bring about democratic change in Eritrea;
2. Take positive actions to support each other in areas of common national interest;
3. Coordinate our diplomatic activities;
4. Work in coordination or coalition among each other towards creating a unified Eritrean opposition movement;
5. Condemn all forms of agreements that the dictatorial regime of Eritrea enters with any foreign government or entity;
6. Call on the Eritrean defense and security forces to stand with their people and be an instrument in charting the democratic change of Eritrea;
7. Work earnestly in the development and application of a common transitional charter;
8. Create an implementation forum; and
9. Invite others to affirm this resolution and participate in the implementation forum.

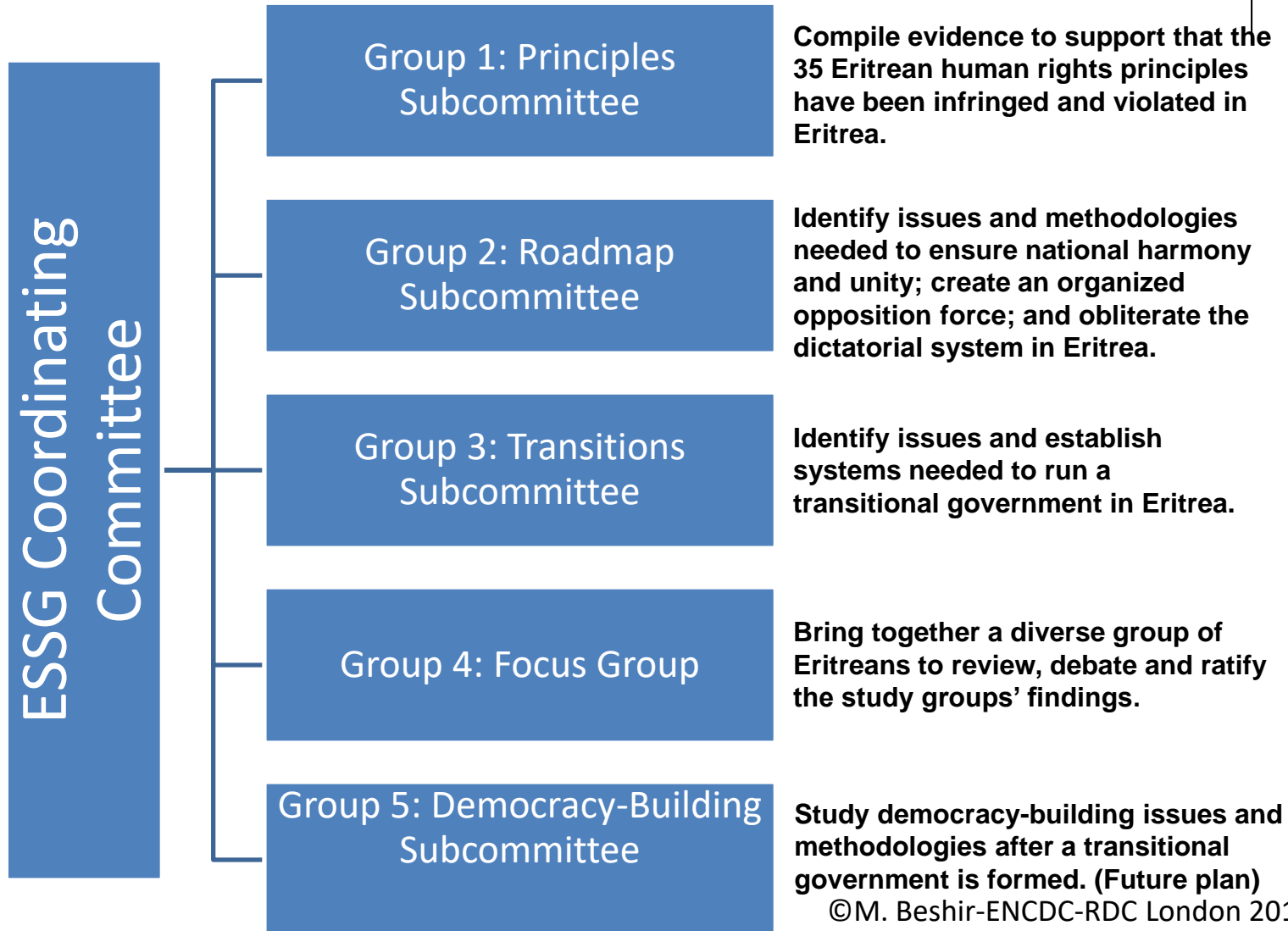
# ESSG Background and Future Prospects



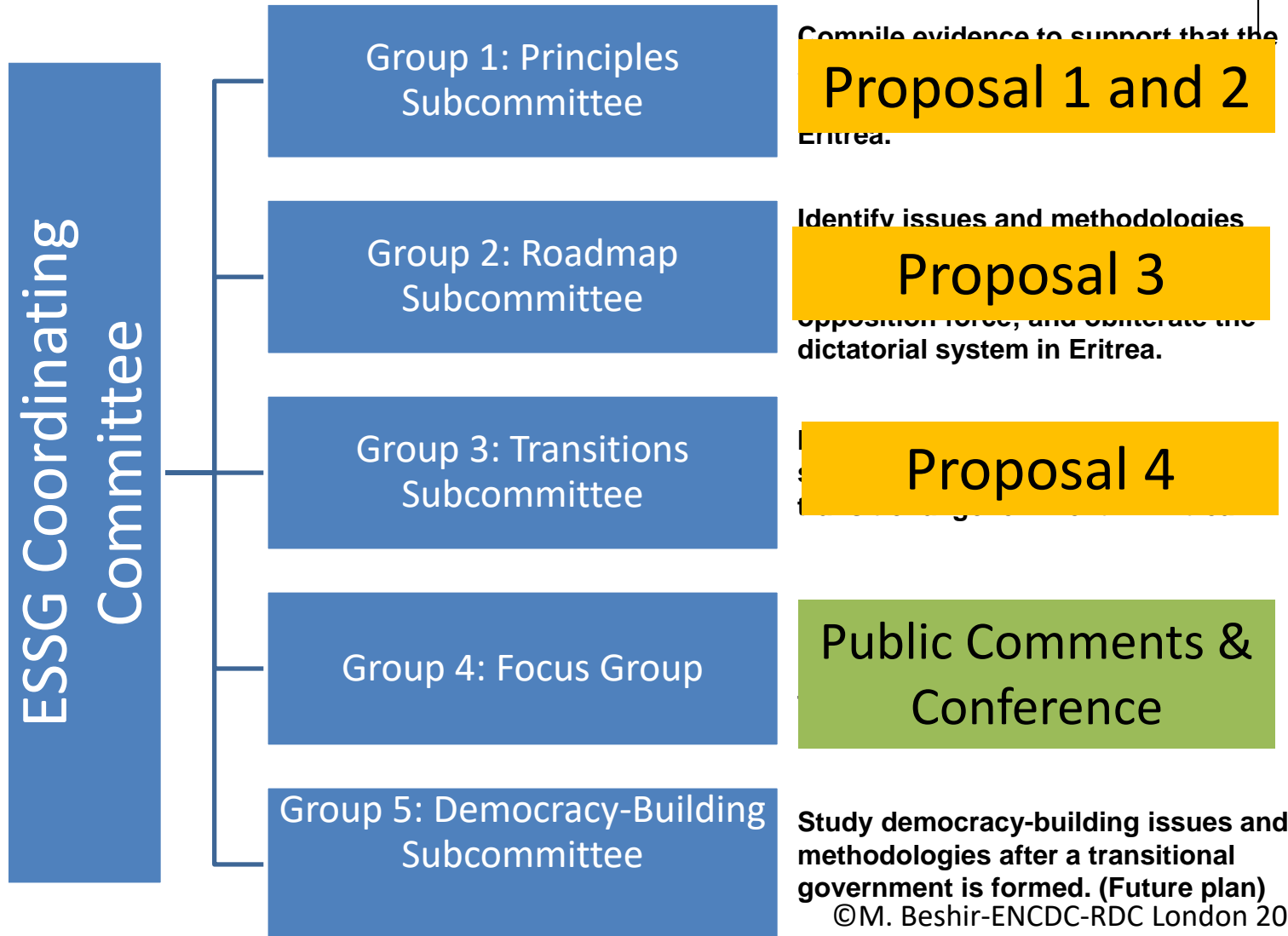
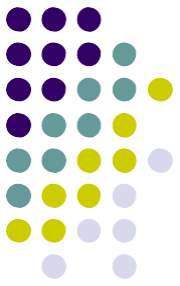
1. The Eritrean Sinit Study Group (ESSG) was established in April 2018, by the group known as Eritrean Sinit Festival Denver (ESFD).
2. The ESSG goal was to facilitate a process in creating a united-front and forward-looking strategy to advance the straggle of the justice-loving Eritreans in bringing a democratic change in Eritrea.
3. In forming ESSG, a core objective of ESFD is to have a true reflection of the diversity of the Eritrea people in the representations of the study group.
4. The ESSG originally consisted of eight Eritrean scholars and professionals that reside in North America, later expanding to three teams, consisting of 30 Eritreans globally.

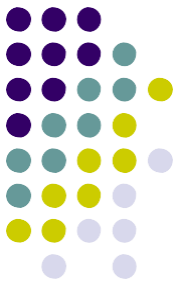


# ESSG Organizational Structure and Functions
